

**EMERY UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT
RESOLUTION NO. 23: 2021-2022**

PROCLAIMING FEBRUARY 2022 AS BLACK HISTORY MONTH

WHEREAS, the month of February is officially celebrated as Black History Month, which dates back to 1926, when Dr. Carter G. Woodson set aside a special period of time in February to recognize the heritage and achievements of Black Americans; and

WHEREAS, over the past century, African American life, history, and culture have become major forces in the United States and the world. In 1915, few could have imagined that African Americans in music, art and literature would become appreciated by the global community. Fewer still could have predicted the prominence achieved by African Americans, as well as other people of African descent, in shaping world politics, war and diplomacy. A century later, few can deny the centrality of African Americans in the making of American history ; and

WHEREAS, black scholars, artists, athletes and leaders self-consciously used their talents to change how the world viewed African Americans and gave the world of cornucopia of cultural gifts, including jazz, poetry, and baseball, track-and-field, football, boxing and basketball. In areas of social movements, African American activism transformed race relations, challenged American foreign policy, and became the American conscience of human rights; and

WHEREAS, in the face of injustices, United States citizens of good will and of all races distinguished themselves with their commitment to the noble ideas which the United States was founded and courageously fought for the rights and freedom of African Americans; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. lived and died to make real these noble ideas; and Barack Hussein Obama was elected the 44th President of the United States, making him the first African American chief executive breaking through racial barriers in politics in this country; and

WHEREAS the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH) was founded in 1915 by Carter G. Woodson who labored under the belief that historical truth would crush falsehoods and usher in a new era of equality, opportunity, and racial democracy, and it has been the association's charge for a century, and ASALH has selected this year's theme, "The Black Family: Representation, Identity and Diversity," in honor of this milestone; and

WHEREAS, the History-Social Science Framework for California Public Schools, Transitional Kindergarten through Grade Twelve states that the history curriculum of community, state, region, and world must reflect the experiences of men and women of different racial, religious, and ethnic groups which is integrated at every grade level; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Emery Unified School District Board of Trustees proclaims the month of February as Black History Month, recognizes the contributions of African Americans in the Nation's history; encourages the continued celebration of this month to provide an opportunity for all schools to learn more about the past and to better understand the African

Americans' experiences that have shaped the Nation, and recognizes that ethnic and racial diversity of the United States enriches and strengthens the Nation.
